

Guidelines for Authors

These guidelines follow the "Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals" by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE). The complete text is available at <http://www.icmje.org> and is also available to be viewed/printed in Adobe Acrobat PDF format at <http://www.icmje.org/icmje.pdf>

For publishing in the Sudanese Journal of Public Health (SJPH), the following are required

1. The subject of the paper should pertain to public health or some other related technical or scientific subject. Clinical problems and issues of public health significance are also welcomed.
2. Articles will be accepted in either Arabic or English.
3. Arabic terminology should be standardized according to the Unified Arabic Medical dictionary.
4. The manuscript should be typed double-spaced including the title page, abstract, acknowledgements, references, tables and legends. Use only one side of each page. White A4-size paper should be used. Adopt Arabic numbering and leave margins of at least 25mm (1 inch) on each side. Use font size equal to 12 point.
5. The title of the paper should be placed on a separate sheet, together with the full name(s) of the author(s), institutional affiliations and highest scientific degrees obtained. The mailing address besides contact information (e-mail, postal address, telephone & fax) of the corresponding author should be provided.
6. The SJPH prefers that all manuscripts be submitted in print form (3 copies). An electronic version is also required and can also be sent as attachment to the following e-mail addresses: *sjph-2005@hotmail.com* or *sjph_2005@yahoo.com*.
7. Original articles should be no longer than 12 double-spaced pages including references. The abstract should be structured with a maximum of 250 words. Headings can include: background, methods, results, discussion and conclusion.
8. Review articles should be no longer than 14 double-spaced pages and should contain sections dealing with objectives, source, methods of selection, compilation and interpretation of data and conclusion.
9. Case reports should be no longer than 3 pages including references.
10. References should follow Vancouver style (see the Uniform requirements) and should focus on recent sources. A maximum of 25 references is advisable.
11. Articles previously published else-where or under consideration of publication by other journals are not acceptable for publication in the SJPH.
12. All papers received will be subjected to peer-review by experts in the relevant field. However, the Editorial Board reserves the right to accept or reject any paper
